He has taught workshops in Nebraska as well as North Dakota, South Dakota, Wisconsin, Iowa, Minnesota and Canada. Marty also enjoys promoting the art of carving. Marty is a member of the Mid-America Woodcarvers Association, and has served as a board member of the Association in the past. Marty specializes in realistic human carvings and Santa's and enjoys carving in basswood, butternut and cottonwood bark. His inspiration comes from reference materials such as historic pictures and books of Native Americans, mountain men and western genre. Marty's project this year is a departure from past projects. The Doane Experience project this year will be a 16" Workshop Santa made from a basswood rough out. It will be mallet carved in the round and painted with oils.
