Chip Carve Delicate Icicle Ornaments

Pierced designs allow you to adjust the size of the carving blank to suit your skill level

By Barry McKenzie

These ornaments combine Old World-style chip carving and tramp-art carving. Tramp-art or hobo-style carving incorporates the edge of the wood into the design.

Piercing on the edges of the icicles, where the patterns line up, creates a unique and delicate-looking ornament. All that's required is a block of wood and a chip carving knife.

After carving, attach a small screw eye to the top. This allows you to hang the ornaments for display and also provides something to hold onto when applying the finish. Apply just enough finish to dampen the surface. Then, add three more coats of finish, applying more finish and wetting the wood more each time to seal the wood around the cuts. The final coat should flood down in the chips. This way I get a crisper cleaner looking cut in all my chip carving.
