### 18. <u>Chip Carved Kaleidoscope</u>---Rich Wagner

### All Levels/12 Students

**5 days** of Chip Carving the exterior of a 7" octagon kaleidoscope. Each side can be carved in one or eight different patterns (patterns will be provided). Materials needed for class: Chip carving knife (any chip carving knife will be acceptable as long as it is sharp). Custom made chip carving knives will be for sale, which you can try before you buy. You will also need a flexible ruler, pencil, compass, scissors, protective carving glove and eraser - ink eraser does it quickly and neatly. Sandpaper, stains, adhesive and patterns will be furnished Instructor will send email.

Cost: \$45.00 plus cost of additional projects \$5.00 - \$50.00

### 22. <u>Decorative Gourds</u>---Breta and Denny Jackson All Levels/12 Students

5 Individual days of decorative gourds. Instructors will provide tools and supplies needed. Students should bring lighting. Monday- Jewelry making pendants and pins. Tuesday- Faux Beading using puff paint on a gourd. Wednesday- staining a gourd and decorating with philodendron sheath and other type of grasses or natural plant textures Thursday – Mask decorated with feathers, paint and or jewelry. Friday - this is the catch up day. There is no charge and will be used to complete all projects. Instructor will send email.

# Wood Carving Safety

Woodcarving and accidents. They are practically connected. We hear about injuries all the time – so much so, that at the Doane Experience they're an award for "First Blood"! Injuries are 100% preventable though – IF you take the time to examine why they occur, and make minor changes to how you operate.

In the shop, there are certain things to look for that can increase your safety and reduce accidents. We'll group them into categories – housekeeping, electrical, ventilation, lighting, and your attitude.

Housekeeping is probably the most important thing to look for. Are you tools neat and orderly? Are they stored properly when you aren't using them? Are chemicals (like paint, varnish, and thinner, as well as cleaners) stored properly, and away from sources of heat or flame? Are shavings and sawdust cleaned regularly? Is clutter eliminated?

Electrical systems are extraordinary important, because as little as 75 milliamps across your heart will kill you. Your 'home' electrical service will deliver 20 amps on any circuit, and any outlet can handle 12 amps. Unless you happen to pull greater than that, don't expect the circuit breaker to trip or the fuse to blow. So, exactly how many things are plugged into one outlet in your shop? Are you running multiple power strips into just one plug? This could set the stage for disaster – you can literally 'melt' the outlet – starting a fire – without tripping the breaker!

Ventilation is critical to your short and long term health. Inhaling wood dust can cause health issues. When carving exotic woods it is especially important to wear a face mask, use a dust filter while carving and vacuum your area after you are done carving. A good dust filter is crucial – keep it clean! Additionally, wood dust is flammable – imagine a buildup of dust suddenly being thrust into the air and contacting a flame source. If you imagine something going 'boom', you are correct!

Lighting, or lack of proper lighting, leads to many lacerations ... and worse. Be sure that your shop is well lit, and if those lights are lower than 7 feet – be sure they are guarded! No one wants to accidentally hit a fluorescent light and be showered in shards of pressurized glass!

Finally, your attitude is key. Do you believe that because of your experience it can't or won't happen to you? If so, you are increasing your risk! Treat every carving session like it could be your last – because if you lose a finger or blow up your shop, it could be! Safety is not just a good idea, it's a good practice, and these tips can help that practice lead to perfection – in the form of zero accidents. Carve safely!
