Doane Update:



Teaching Strategies

The following is guide for those who want to teach a carving class and who desire some direction concerning how to conduct a class.

- 1. **SELF CONFIDENCE**-You must feel like you are capable of teaching others to successfully complete whatever project you choose to instruct. Self-confidence is contagious.
- 2. **DEVELOP A PLAN**-Create a step by step process for carving and completing the project. This could also include step by step models for the students to see. You have to realize that all people don't learn the same way. Some can learn by listening alone. Some learn by seeing the process and actually holding the project.
- 3. **BE PREPARED**-Have everything ready and available beforehand.
- 4. **EXPLAIN THE ENTIRE PROJECT BEFORE YOU BEGIN THE PROJECT**-By explaining the project this will give the students an idea of what they will be doing and give them a goal for completing the project. It will also develop confidence for the students in your ability to instruct them. Also talk about the tools needed to carve the project. Show the students what the tools look like. You also need to have at least one completed project for the students to see.
- 5. **DEMONSTRATE AND EXPLAIN EACH STEP**-This will help all types of learners to understand what they need to do. Also talk to the students about the kinds of tools you are using for each step. Pass the tools around so the students can see them (sometimes you will have to help a student find an alternate tool if he/ she doesn't have what you are using) Pass your carving around and point out what you have done (if you have a large class you may need to work on two pieces at the same time to speed up the class) Be prepared to re-demonstrate if necessary. Some students pick up your process slower than others. You also need to take into account that you have both right and left-handed carvers. Remember that your carvers will have different skill levels. Take nothing for granted.
- 6. **OBSERVE AND ASSIST**-After you have demonstrated the step it is time for the students to carve. Observe each student as they work and offer assistance or advice as necessary. Also provide positive feedback on individual student progress.
- 7. **WORK AT A PACE COMFORTABLE FOR THE CLASS**-Once you have begun teaching you will get a feel for the ability level of your students and how fast you can move along as the class progresses.
- 8. **REMEMBER: YOU ARE TEACHING HOW TO CARVE/NOT JUST HOW TO DO YOUR PROJECT**-you can teach your students how to feed themselves (carve on their own and be confident about what they are doing) Or you can feed your students and they will remain dependent on you or another instructor to take them step by step through a project, never feeling any confidence in their ability to carve independently.
- 9. **HAVE FUN**-If you are relaxed and confident about what you are teaching this will transfer to your students and they, and you, will enjoy your class.




