# In my ongoing quest to provide useable information "aka why can't I find butternut 8 X 8's"

Butternut canker caused by the fungus Sirococcus clavigignenti-juglandacear is killing Butternut trees. It was first reported in Wisconsin in 1967, the disease has killed 80 % of the butternut in some states. The canker kills trees of all ages including young saplings, the fungus can survive on dead trees for at least 20 months. The USDA forest service reports a dramatic decrease in the number of live butternut trees in the United States. In Wisconsin a 58 percent decrease in live Butternut trees was measured in the last 15 years, in Michigan it was reported at 84 percent. A recent study by the Wisconsin DNR reported 91 percent of the live butternut trees were diseased. There is however hope as disease free trees have been found in 19 states. These trees are growing alongside of severely cankered trees. These trees are identified and grafted to root stock and the nuts are also collected. It is too early to tell but the preliminary data looks promising for saving this species.

SO now you know why butternut is getting harder to locate, of all the wood I cut it is my favorite, I love the smell and it is such a beautiful wood I hope they are successful!!!

Now impress all your wood carving friends use Sirococcus clavigignenti-juglandacear in your next conversation.
