So the cold weather has got you down..... What in the world is there to do when it is too cold to go outside.....

Well you can CARVE, and then you paint your project, and then what?

Well I know what I did on a Sunday a few weeks ago. I was at Gretna and someone needed two bases. I didn't have any left so I said I would make two Saturday night and bring them Sunday. I made two and also brought two of my own bases that were under two of the carvings I did with Kirt Curtis. I figured I would not need them but, just in case her carvings needed a big base.

So she decided to take all four, that was great but now I am without my own bases. So I decided (helped along by constantly tripping over these same boards in my garage) it was base making Sunday. It was too cold to go outside but warm in the heated confines of my workshop. It was "*Katy bar the door time*" and I had the old planner and band saw in high production mode. I could have just made two as replacements for the ones I needed, but what the heck. It was cold outside and I was really, really, sick of these boards being in the way, every time I turned around. So here is the results of the walnut cutting frenzy.....

In the end, I am not even sure how many I made. I know I also cut two maple ones, and some out of a chunk of white oak, that got too close to the base making machine I had become. I had two piles of scraps walnut and thought what could I do with these. Then it hit me they would make the good fire making scraps (expensive firewood). I sat by the fire and played rummy with my wife kind of night. It was very relaxing despite losing, although as I put scraps in, I had to fight that urge to hold some back. I always see something that scraps could be used for, it is an illness no doubt about it.

I really find enjoyment making bases, of course it helps to have a stack walnut laying around. After all the times I have tripped over those boards I finally decide enough was enough! I guess I showed that walnut who the boss was.

I even ended up with a couple figured wood bases, I may even use for one of my own carvings. I need to hide them quick, Kirt manages to find them, he is part bloodhound for figured walnut bases. He teases me that I always try and hide them from him, which is only partly true. I am always happy when my base sits under other peoples carvings.

I think I must be getting older as the 5" stock is just too heavy to put on top of the pile. I remember cutting 8 X 8 X 8 butternut cants and moving them by myself, I think those days are gone. This time as I was unable to get my kids into helping I managed to get a nephew to help. I think on the next pile we will go big to little on the stacking.

I am waiting for some red oak timber that is too muddy to get until the weather makes up its mind cold and frozen or warm and dry. Weather in the Midwest is always a hard one to predict accurately.

Random Thoughts.....

Well spring is practically upon us, I am trying to convince myself of that. I am looking forward to getting back to mowing, I am sure I have mentioned my love of mowing. I had a great time at the Gretna retreat, and was able to visit with lots of folks, and see what they were working on. I managed in between polar blasts to get some wood cut and stacked so it will be ready to air dry once warm weather returns. I am also excited for fishing season, I am running low on walleye fillets in the freezer.

My wife and I are very excited as Katy and Zac had a baby girl a few weeks ago. This is our first Grandchild so it is all new to us. I held her in the hospital, and it was the first time I had held a baby since Seth was a baby, 19 years ago. This will take some getting used to but, I am looking forward to spoiling my granddaughter. I am working on a crib for her, ideally it would already be done. It was supposed to be finished before the baby came, however I had some supply issues, that slowed me down. I was unable to supply the motivation to get into my workshop to build it. As I was in the garage I was getting a few oak boards out and had to move some wood to get to the oak. As I was moving the wood I noticed the floor needed sweeping. Once I found the broom, by the band saw I noticed the band saw could use a good cleaning. I went to roll the band saw out, and I backed into a stack of basswood, which needed restacking. While restacking the basswood, I knocked over some walnut cut offs I save for bases. While I bent over to pick up the base blanks, I knocked over these walnut boards, leaning against a wood rack. I had tripped these over before and had finally had it. I fired up the chop saw and the band saw and went on a base making frenzy. When I was done, I went back in to the house, my wife said how's the crib coming along? Right on schedule "Honey" just like I promised.....
