What is it you ask, that you have to drop everything, and buy right now. It is a carving glove. There are many on the market, so check them out and buy a good quality glove. Take this one piece of advise, and you may save enough money in medical bills to offset a brand new set of Swiss made carving tools. I have left hand experience in this matter and believe me getting 13 stitches isn't a great way to spend a Saturday morning.
